### Availability of Instructional Resources and Information Technology

- Indiana University (IU) is consistently ranked among the nation's best universities in providing technology resources for its students. IU was recently named the nation's 'most wired' public university by *PC Magazine*.
- With more than 1,600 wireless nodes on the network, Indiana University Bloomington (IUB) students have access to high-speed Internet literally anywhere on the campus.
- The more than 2,500 network servers enable 100% of IU classrooms, residence halls, and faculty to be connected to the campus network/internet.
- With nearly 3,500 workstations, 180 software applications in labs, classrooms, and clusters IUB excels in computing capabilities for students.

In an effort to monitor the level of usage UITS gathers statistics on the number of student technology consultant customer contacts (99,308 in FY 2006), workstation logins, Library reference interactions, UITS Support Center walk-in contacts and the number of UITS Help-Line inquiries (1,583,379 campus-wide in FY 2006). Additionally UITS conducts real-time satisfaction surveys of users in the areas of telephone consulting, walk-in consulting, online support resources, training, and data management support. UITS reviews this information to analyze user's needs and make appropriate facility and staffing changes to meet the ever increasing demands of students to offer responsive, state of the art computing facilities and assistance.
